

**ORDINANCE NO. 5**

**UNION STREET**

***AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE  
ACCEPTING OF UNION STREET***

The Village of Port Austin Ordains that whereas Charles B. Cottrell did on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of May 1882 duly record a plat in the Registers office for Huron County Michigan of Certain lands now within the corporate limits of Port Austin, and did by said act duly and legally dedicate a strip of land for the purpose of a street and known and described on said plat as Union Street and being 50 feet wide and dividing blocks 2 and 3 of his said plat.

Therefore the Common Council of said Village of Port Austin confirms and accepts of said Union Street as dedicated by Charles B. Cottrell and also confirms and accepts of Union Street as dedicated by Samuel S. Robinson according to his original plat which is duly recorded in the Registers office for Huron County Michigan of lands situated within the corporate limits of said Village of Port Austin.
